### **Public Comment**

Herbert Schlegel, 301 W. Montgomery Avenue, thanked the Borough for their hard work during the winter season. He also thanked his neighbors for their assistance after he injured himself from a slip and fall accident. Mr. Schlegel asked if the Borough could put information in the newsletter or on the Borough website relating to obtaining a veterans' photo discount identification card, a program offered to Veterans by Montgomery County.

### **Discussion: Required Public Announcement/Synopsis of the MS4 Program**

Solicitor Gifford read out loud a synopsis of the MS4 program for the public. All members of the public in attendance were asked to sign-in, acknowledging that they heard the announcement.

### **Consideration: Approval of Minutes for March 13, 2018**

Member Neiderhiser made a motion to approve the minutes of March 13, 2018. Member McClure seconded the motion. Motion passed 9 yes, 0 no.

### **Consideration: Disbursements: \$79,468.34**

Manager Hart requested an amendment to the total of the disbursements, as three additional invoices had arrived since the bills list was created. She added \$2,693.81 to the total being reviewed. Member Amato asked about the fees for the alarm system and inquired whether the system is tested. Manager Hart explained it is tested annually, and sometimes unintentionally when set off by staff members. He also asked about police tasers and a holster expenses. Chief Fantry explained that the additional holster ordered was for left handed use versus right handed.

Member Scott made a motion to approve payment of the bills in the amount of \$82,162.15. Member O'Neill seconded the motion. Motion passed 9 yes, 0 no.

### **Old Business/Committee & Board Reports/Zoning Applications**

Assistant Manager Guzzardo announced the Borough had received revised plans for the minor two-lot subdivision at 715 E. Montgomery Avenue and that they been circulated to Council for review. He also informed Council the application would be on the April 10<sup>th</sup> Agenda.

### **Solicitor / Mayor / Council / Manager**

Mayor D'Angelo thanked Manager Hart and the staff for some of the newly framed maps and business card holder that has been displayed in the Council meeting room.

Manager Hart announced that the Historic Commission presentation; that had been scheduled for March 19<sup>th</sup>, has been rescheduled for April 17<sup>th</sup>. She announced that the Borough will be holding its Third Annual Earth Day Extravaganza Celebration on April 21<sup>st</sup> at Borough Hall from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Also mentioned was the upcoming, April 28<sup>th</sup>, Drug Take Back Event hosted by the Police Department. Manager Hart reminded members of the public and Council that all Borough News and Events are posted on the Borough's Facebook Page as well as the Borough's website. In closing, Manager Hart shared a slide show of pictures from the Easter Egg Hunt, held on March 24<sup>th</sup> and shared a recent tour of the Borough facilities to North Wales Boy Scouts (Tiger Pack 84).

Member Scott made a motion to adjourn. Member Neiderhiser seconded the motion. Motion passed 9 yes, 0 no.
