

## Message from the Mayor:



Time has certainly been flying by, thanks to all of the activity we've seen. Our Borough just enjoyed a very successful July 4th Parade and Picnic, thanks to the tireless efforts of the North Wales Community Project Alliance. Given how they just jump right in and get to work, perhaps they should consider renaming themselves the North Wales Community Action Alliance.

Independence Day was not the only cause for celebration over the past few months.

On May 10, the North Penn Volunteer Fire Company received its new tiller truck Ladder 62. Its long awaited arrival was quite an event. Many saw it for the first time at the July 4th Parade.

The Borough's Comprehensive Plan: North Wales Borough 2040 has been completed. It is currently in the midst of the required 45-day review period. Given the amount of work that was involved, you can understand why these plans are only required to be updated every ten years. Many thanks to the North Wales 2040 Steering Committee and our partner, The Montgomery County Planning Commission.

Work is in earnest for the Borough's Sesquicentennial in 2019. Some of the events planned are an inter-faith service, a banquet at the William Penn Inn, the ringing of church bells on August 20 and a September parade, just to name a few. Look for more information at this year's Community Day on September 29.

Since its dedication last September 19, the Historic Commission's "Walls of History" continues to amaze visitors. Comments range from "I remember going there" to "Look at those prices" to "Why are they dressed like that?" (That last one came from my granddaughter.) The most recent comment was yesterday's "We found our mother", spoken by the daughters of former North Wales Elementary School 5th grade teacher Betty Blair. They were visiting with their mother Betty Blair Jentsch, who now resides in Chevy Chase, MD. Betty taught when the elementary school was located at 300 School Street (Borough Hall). That photo of Betty? It was not of her teaching in the classroom. It was of her as a member of the North Wales High School Marching Band in 1945. (She graduated in 1948.)

North Wales continues to be a desirable place to live, as evidenced by the high demand for housing. As I said in my Spring/Summer message, this is due to the work of Christine Hart, our Borough Manager and her staff, our dedicated Police Department, and our residents who contribute so much to make North Wales such a great town.

In June I attended the Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs Conference in Hershey. In addition to eating more than my normal allotment of chocolate; I attended classes and panel discussions. PSAB provides courses for elected officials and administrators throughout the year. I am proud to say that both Christine Hart and I have completed PSAB's Certified Borough Official (CBO) Program. By the way, our own State Rep. Kate Harper has participated as a legislative panelist for the past several years. At this year's conference, one of the panelists, Rep. Robert Freeman from Northampton County, a Democrat, spoke of how he and Kate work well together.

## Don't Forget to Disconnect and Winterize Your Rain Barrel

To extend the life of your rain barrel, you should plan to winterize it. Over the winter months, water left in a rain barrel will freeze, expand, and crack the rain barrel. Winterizing is easy...just follow these three simple steps:

- Disconnect the downspout from the rain barrel, and re-connect a downspout extension to the main downspout to funnel water away from the foundation of the house.
- Empty the rain barrel.

 Flip the rain barrel upside-down and store it outside, or, if you have room, move the rain barrel into a garage or basement.



#### Veterans' Photo ID Discount Card

By Pennsylvania Statute of 1868 the Montgomery County Recorder of Deeds office is authorized to record the military discharge papers of veterans, commonly known as DD214 and NGB22. Veterans should bring their DD214 (military discharge papers) and a photo identification card (such as a Pennsylvania Drivers' License) with them to record their discharge papers either to the office in Norristown or at one of our mobile events. There is no fee to record military discharge papers and the document copies are only accessible by the veteran, his or her immediate family, an authorized agent by written request, or the director of the department of veterans' affairs. Note, discharge papers recorded over seventy-five years ago are publicly accessible via their online database.



The Montgomery County Recorder of Deeds encourages all veterans to record their DD214s for safekeeping and is providing veterans with photo ID cards and a corresponding program to receive discounts for goods and services from participating merchants. Veterans will be able to present these cards to businesses throughout our region that have agreed to provide a discount to Montgomery County veterans in appreciation for the veterans' service to our country. All veterans who visit the Recorder's Office to record their DD214 (military discharge papers) and obtain their photo ID will be given a list of participating businesses.

## The North Wales Police Department

#### **IRS Imposter Scams**

Someone calls and says they are from the IRS. They say you owe back taxes and you have to pay it right away or face dire consequences. They tell you to put the money on a prepaid debit card and give them the numbers right away. They might even know your social security number and the caller ID could read Washington DC. Is it really the IRS?

No. The real IRS won't ask you to pay with a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They also won't ask for a credit card over the phone. And when they contact you about unpaid taxes they do it by mail, not the phone. And caller ID can be fake.

If this happens to you – stop. Don't wire money, pay with a credit card or prepaid debit card. If you send that money it will be gone! If you have a tax question, go to irs.gov or call them at 1-800-829-1040.

#### **Identity Theft**

Someone gets your personal information and runs up bills in your name. They may use your social security or Medicare number, your credit cards or your medical insurance – along with your good name.

How do you know that this is happening to you? You could get bills for things that you didn't buy or services you didn't get. Your bank account shows withdrawals you did not make. You might not get bills you expect or find accounts that you never knew about.

Protect your information. Shred documents, have strong passwords and only give out your social security number when you have to. Read your monthly bank statements and check your credit. Once a year, get your credit report for FREE from AnnualCreditReport.com or 1- 877-322-8228. The law entitles you to one free report each year from each credit reporting company.

If you spot a scam, please report it to the Federal Trade Commission at 1-877-FTC-HELP or go online to: www.ftc.gov/complaint.

Your complaint can help protect other people. By filing a complaint, you can help the FTC's investigators identify the imposters and stop them before they can harm someone else.

#### **Looking Out for Our Housebound Residents**

We check in on elderly and disabled neighbors when there is a threat of a snowstorm. Recognizing that the need goes beyond the winter months, the Mayor has initiated a program whereby the Borough will help those that are housebound due to the infirmities of old age, disabilities, or other medical issues.

Residents that are housebound may request that the Borough check in on them. A member of our Police Department will visit them to determine the extent of service they wish to receive.

Neighbors, friends or family may also contact the Borough (215-699-4424) on behalf of a resident or to suggest someone who might benefit from this service.

# North Wales Borough Recycling: It really DOES matter...

Recycling is required in North Wales Borough. Educating the public about recycling is an important element of our recycling program and is required by Pennsylvania Act 101, the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act. The purpose of this notice is to provide recycling information and requirements including residential curbside recycling, what materials you can recycle, yard waste collection, and commercial and non-residential recycling. Residents MUST make arrangements for recycling with the hauler of their choice. See below for a list of haulers that operate in the Borough. Though each hauler has its own instructions explaining what materials to recycle and how to sort them, see below for a list of commonly recycled materials. Haulers may pick up other materials in addition to these. Please contact your hauler with any questions about recycling materials, material sorting, and collection schedules.

Recycling is one of the best ways for you to have a positive impact on the world in which we live. Recycling is important to both the natural environment and us. We must act fast as the amount of waste we create is increasing all the time.

#### Residential Curbside Recycling

- Cartons food and beverage cartons such as milk, juice, soup, broth, etc.

#### Yard Waste

Haulers in North Wales Borough will provide curbside collection of leaf and yard waste at least once during the spring and once during the fall of each year. North Wales Borough does NOT allow burning of yard waste. Act 101 defines "yard waste" as twigs, shrub trimmings, small branches, and like vegetative matter, and "leaf waste" as leaves, garden residues, shrubbery and tree trimmings, and similar material, but does not include grass clippings.

#### **Residential Drop-Off Recycling**

North Wales Borough residents and businesses can take yard waste and other materials to the Barnside Farm composting facility located at 991 Haldeman Road in Schwenksville, PA. Questions can be directed to them at 610-287-8880.

#### **Commercial and Non-Residential Recycling**

North Wales Borough is a member of the Northern Montgomery County Recycling Commission (NMCRC), a group of 11 municipalities that work together to increase recycling and promote recycling awareness and education in compliance with the state's recycling law, PA Act 101 of 1988, as amended. Residential permit parking zones limit parking to residents and their guests during the hours of 6AM to 6PM, Monday - Friday. This program helps to ensure that residents of densely populated areas have reasonable access to parking near their residences. Vehicles parked in a permit parking zone must display an annual permit or daily pass or they may be ticketed. Permit parking stickers are available at the Police Department during regular business hours.

A home occupation permit is required for any home-based business. The regulations are provided under the Borough's Zoning Ordinance (Chapter 208). **Residents living in the Historic District** must apply to the Historic Architectural Review Board (HARB) before making any building façade changes. Please contact Borough staff to see if the changes being planned require a Certificate of Appropriateness from H.A.R.B.

A solicitation permit is required before engaging in any transient business-related activities within the Borough. The fee is \$100.00, applications are available online at www.northwalesborough. org. Registered individuals must carry a copy of the permit and it must be available upon request. Please contact the North Wales Borough Police Department to report any suspicious activity.

All rental properties must register annually, the fee is \$50.00 per address. Rental Inspections are completed biennial and are the responsibility of the property owner to arrange by calling Borough Hall during normal business hours. Rental permit applications are available online at www.northwalesborough.org

All businesses in the Borough must obtain an Annual Business License, this includes home businesses too! The fee is \$100.00, applications are available online at www.northwalesborough.org. Business License fees are due January 31st of every year or prior to opening your business within the Borough.
