## North Wales Arts and Cultural Center

The newly renovated North Wales Arts and Cultural Center at 125 N. Main Street will soon open its doors, unveiling a stunning transformation that promises to enrich our community for generations to come.



Originally established in 2022, the center provided a space for the arts and small-scale public performances in North Wales Borough. However, aging infrastructure and the growing demand for more versatile spaces led to the decision to undertake a major renovation.

The renovations have completely transformed the space. The old offices and classrooms have been opened to create a banquet hall with a beautiful view of the original American chestnut beams and southern yellow pine hardwood floors. New HVAC systems have been added and zoned to create comfort throughout every space. Accessibility improvements, such as the addition of a lift and two new ADA-compliant restrooms, ensure that everyone can fully enjoy the center. Sustainability was also a key focus, with energy-efficient lighting and a conversion to natural gas for heating fuel reducing the center’s environmental footprint.

The building features three facets that will all serve the community in different ways.

1. The Non-Profit Center consists of two spaces, one which houses a regular tenant, The Partnership Transportation Management Association of Montgomery County, and another which will be a flexible space for non-profit meetings, off-site office needs, or an accompaniment to uses of the other spaces in the building.
2. The Banquet Hall is a beautiful space to be rented for parties, weddings, luncheons, corporate meetings, etc. An exclusive caterer will service the space for food, drink, and event coordination.
3. The Performing Arts Center in the old chapel will be a performance venue hosting musical performances, speaker series, and other entertainment that suits the space.

This project was made possible through funding by the Montgomery County Recovery Office and The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program.



## Rainbows Belong in the Sky – Not in Your Driveway!



Next time it rains, look down at your driveway or the nearest parking lot. See any colorful "oil rainbows" slicked across the pavement? It's a sign that someone's car is leaking fluids. The rainbows might look pretty, but these fluid leaks are composed of highly toxic materials such as antifreeze, motor oil, brake fluid and/or transmission fluid. When the toxins enter the storm drain system or leach into the soil, our surface and groundwater supplies are contaminated and that means your drinking water supplies are put at risk. You rely on your car for safe, convenient transportation. Why not treat it right and protect water quality at the same time?

- Repair auto fluid leaks right away. Use a drip pan to catch leaks if repairs are delayed.
- Collect and dispose of fluids from routine maintenance properly.

Montgomery County hosts a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program to assist residents with disposal of toxic home materials. ## When nature calls, make sure you pick up. Clean Up After Your Pet

Did you know that pet waste contains bacteria that makes our waterways unsafe for swimming and other recreational activities? Most of us pick up after our pets to be good neighbors and keep our yard clean. But there's another important reason to clean up after our pets: pet waste contains bacteria that is harmful to our water.

An average size dog dropping contains 3 billion fecal coliform bacteria and other pathogens that could be a health hazard! Leaving it on the sidewalk or in the yards means that harmful bacteria can get washed into storm drains and roadside ditches that flow directly into our lakes and rivers untreated. Noting that 40% of households have a dog, you can imagine the potential problems if all, or even a portion of that amount of waste ended up in our surface waters that are being used for recreational and other purposes.



So, what can you do? Simple. Whether you are in your yard or on a walk, dispose of your pet's waste promptly in the trash or toilet to prevent it from entering storm drains and roadside ditches. **Pick up after your pet...and help keep our water clean.**



# Knox Box

## Attention business owners!

Did you know a Knox Box Rapid Access System can automatically notify the police whenever it is opened?

A Knox Box is a high-security key lock box. It's designed to hold keys for your place of business with only first responders having the ability to gain access. Should an emergency occur, responders will be able to quickly gain access without having to force entry into the building. This saves time and prevents damage to your building.



Business owners throughout the nation trust Knox Box systems to provide safe entry for first responders to your building in case of an emergency, and many local organizations are getting on board.

If you own a business and do not have a Knox Box, the North Penn Volunteer Fire Company and North Wales Police Department would like to personally meet you at your place of business to explain their safety and security features and how the system could work for you. # Recycling News

## Recycling is Required

Municipal and State regulations require that residents, commercial establishments, and non-residential establishments recycle all recyclable materials. Commonly recycled materials include:

-  Paper – newspaper, office/copy paper, glossy paper, cardboard, junk mail, phone books, cereal/cracker boxes
-  Plastic – recycle plastic by shape: bottles, jars, tubs, and jugs
-  Glass – clear, green and brown containers
-  Metal – aluminum, steel, tin, and bimetal cans and containers

You should check with your hauler for a complete list of acceptable recyclable materials.

## Contaminated Recycle Materials

Contaminated recycling materials cannot be recycled and usually end up going to a landfill. Here is a list of contaminants that make recycle material non-recyclable:

1. Plastic Bags: Do not place your recycle materials in a plastic bag. Plastic bags cannot be recycled. The recycler will either waste time removing the plastic bag or worst, discard the bag and its contents and send it to a landfill.
2. Food Wastes: Uncleaned containers with leftover food waste cannot be recycled. Containers contaminated with food wastes will be sent to a landfill. You need to wash food containers and remove all of the food before placing the containers into your recycle bin.
3. Bright-Colored Paper: In general, bright-colored paper should not be recycled.
4. Frozen Food Containers: The coating on frozen food containers makes them non-recyclable.
5. Shredded Paper: Shredded paper should not be placed in your recycle bin.
6. Caps and Tops to Bottles, Jars, and Containers: Caps and tops are not recyclable; throw these in the trash, not the recycle bin.

We all want to maximize our recycling efforts, but we need to recycle the correct materials in the correct manner. Otherwise, we mess up the recycling facility, and much of our “recycled waste” ends up in a landfill. You should check with your hauler if you have any questions about what materials can be recycled.

# How to Safely Use Fertilizers in Your Garden and Lawn

As spring approaches, many residents are preparing to fertilize their gardens and lawns to ensure lush greenery and vibrant blooms. While fertilizers can enhance plant growth, improper use can harm the environment, your health, and even your plants. Here's how to safely and responsibly use fertilizers to protect your home and community.

## Why Fertilizer Safety Matters

Fertilizers contain nutrients like nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium, which are essential for plant health. However, when used improperly, they can:

- **Pollute Waterways:** Excess fertilizer can run off into local streams, rivers, and lakes, causing algae blooms that harm aquatic life.
- **Damage Soil Health:** Over-fertilizing can lead to nutrient imbalances in the soil, making it harder for plants to thrive.
- **Pose Health Risks:** Misapplication of certain fertilizers can harm pets, wildlife, and even humans.

## Tips for Safe Fertilizer Use

### 1. Choose the Right Fertilizer

- Select a fertilizer suited to your plants and soil. Perform a soil test to determine what nutrients your lawn or garden actually needs.
- Opt for organic or slow-release fertilizers when possible, as they reduce the risk of over-application and nutrient runoff.

### 2. Read and Follow Instructions

- Carefully read the label on your fertilizer package. Pay attention to recommended application rates and methods.
- Avoid the “more is better” mentality. Over-fertilizing can burn plants and cause environmental damage.

### 3. Time It Right

- Apply fertilizers during the growing season when plants can absorb nutrients.
- Avoid fertilizing before heavy rain, as it can wash the fertilizer away, wasting resources and contributing to water pollution.

### 4. Apply Carefully

- Use a spreader to ensure even application on lawns and prevent clumping.
- Keep fertilizer at least 10-15 feet away from streams, drains, or other water sources to minimize runoff.
- Sweep up any fertilizer that spills onto driveways, sidewalks, or streets to prevent it from washing into storm drains.

### 5. Store Fertilizers Safely

- Store fertilizers in a cool, dry place, away from children and pets.
- Keep containers tightly sealed to prevent spills or contamination.

## Environmentally Friendly Alternatives

If you're looking to minimize chemical fertilizer use, consider these eco-friendly options:

- **Composting:** Use kitchen scraps and yard waste to create a natural, nutrient-rich compost for your garden.
- **Mulching:** Apply organic mulch around plants to retain moisture and add nutrients to the soil as it decomposes.
- **Native Plants:** Plant species that are naturally suited to your region often require less fertilization and maintenance.





## Lead and Copper Survey Updates

### Continuing I&I Project

Inflow and Infiltration (I&I) occurs when rainwater, snow melt, or groundwater enters the sewer system, including manholes. While manholes are essential to maintaining the sewage collection system, excess water can lead to many challenges, including sewer system overflows and environmental issues, increased treatment costs to the ratepayers, and upsetting the operational and hydraulic balance of the downstream wastewater treatment plant. Contrary to popular opinion, adding stormwater or groundwater to the sanitary sewer system is not helpful and has many downsides.

To combat these issues, and in an ongoing effort to identify and remedy I&I problems throughout our sewer system, our team will inspect up to 80 manholes for potential vulnerabilities over the next few months. This includes identifying damaged or cracked structures, loose or aging covers, and joints where groundwater might seep in. We'll also evaluate manhole covers located below street level, where water tends to pool, and make necessary repairs and height adjustments. Each manhole repair can cost up to \$7,000,00, however, not doing this work could cost even more over the long term.

Our approach aligns with guidelines and recommendations from the EPA, PADEP, and other environmental organizations, which emphasize best practices for reducing and eliminating I&I in public sewer systems. These efforts not only comply with established standards but also reflect our commitment to maintaining a reliable and efficient sewer system for our community.

By addressing I&I, we're taking proactive steps to ensure sustainable operations and provide the best possible service and cost efficiency for our customers.

As you may know from our recent mailing, the EPA has mandated a nationwide program to locate and eliminate lead and galvanized water service lines, both public and private. Unfortunately, the EPA mandated wording of our recent mailing created some confusion and unnecessary concerns, resulting in over 500 calls and customers visiting our offices.

Please rest assured that there is absolutely no issue with lead in the water we provide. We have no lead water mains, and our water complies with every water quality mandate of the EPA and PaDEP. The federal program is intended to identify and inventory the type of water service line leading from our water main in the street into the home or business.

We are making great progress on our Service Line Inventory (SLI) Project, a vital initiative, and to date, we have identified very few lead service lines, totaling less than 1% of the water service lines throughout the system!

Thanks to the many customers who shared details about their water service lines. Your participation plays a crucial role in compliance with both the EPA and PADEP Lead and Copper Rule, and we deeply value your engagement and support.

## What is the Historic District?

Established in 2000 by Borough Council, the North Wales Historic Preservation District serves to protect the distinctive architecture that serves as a reminder of the Borough's rich history.

## What is HARB?

The Historical Architectural Review Board, or HARB, is a public advisory body created by state and local laws. HARB's purpose is to protect the distinctive and historic character of North Wales Borough by considering the effects of proposed changes to properties within the Historic District and ruling on their appropriateness. HARB meetings take place every 3rd Wednesday of the month in the Borough Council Room at 7:00 pm. These meetings are open to the public.

Properties in the Historic District are subject to special provisions provided under Chapter 130 of the North Wales Borough Code. Exterior alterations may require approval by the Historical Architectural Review Board (HARB). Keep in mind any alterations to buildings inside the Historic District cannot proceed unless HARB has reviewed the application. Please contact Borough staff with any questions or concerns.

All properties in the Historic District are subject to the provisions set in place by HARB, regardless of when they were built. The Historic District was created by Borough Council to preserve the Borough's history as extensively as possible.

# Grill Safely, Burn Responsibly: A Guide to Outdoor Grilling and Fire Safety

As the weather warms up, many North Wales residents look forward to outdoor grilling and recreational fire pits. Outdoor grilling and recreational fires are great ways to enjoy the outdoors and gather with family and friends. However, it's important to follow safety guidelines to protect yourself, your property, and the community. Outdoor burning in North Wales is permitted for the following uses according to Chapter 101 of the Borough Code:

**1. Cooking:** Outdoor grilling and cooking are permitted, but there are some important guidelines:

- Grills or fires for cooking must be at least 15 feet away from any combustible materials, such as buildings or trees.
- Cooking units cannot be placed on balconies or porches more than one story above ground level.
- Ensure your grilling activity follows any other applicable safety regulations or statutes.

**2. Chimeneas and Fire Pit Tables:** The use of chimeneas or outdoor tables with fire pits is allowed if they meet specific requirements:

- Only untreated wood may be burned.
- All fire containers must have a screen cover with openings no larger than one-inch square to contain flying ashes.
- Fire containers must be at least 15 feet away from any structure.

**3. Outdoor Fireplaces:** Fireplaces built with zoning or building permits are permitted if used safely.

Regardless of the type of outdoor fire you plan to have, keep in mind these important safety tips.

- **Never leave a fire unattended.** Fires should always be monitored, especially when grilling or enjoying a bonfire. An adult must supervise recreational fires until they are completely extinguished.
- **Ensure proper fire containment.** Whether you're grilling or enjoying a fire pit, use fire containers with a secure lid or screen to prevent the spread of embers and ashes.
- **Check wind conditions.** High winds can quickly spread flames or embers. Avoid outdoor grilling or fires during windy conditions.
- **Have fire extinguishing tools on hand.** Keep a hose, fire extinguisher, or a bucket of water nearby in case of emergencies.
- **Clean your grill regularly.** Grease buildup can cause flare-ups, so be sure to clean your grill after each use to maintain safety.

By complying with local fire safety regulations, you help protect your property, your neighbors, and the environment. Stay safe and enjoy your outdoor cooking and fire activities responsibly!

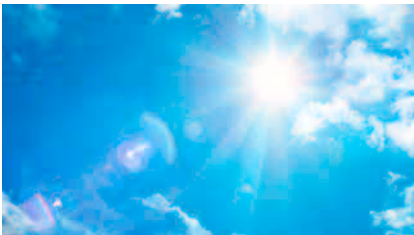

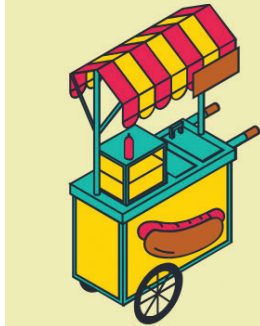
