Public Comment

Consideration: Approval of \$500 Sponsorship Donation to NWAL

Manager Hart explained that the library requested a sponsorship donation for their Farm to Table Gala. This had been discussed in 2024 and was budgeted for consideration in the 2025 Budget, the Finance Committee had also been advised and recommended approval accordingly.

Mayor McDevitt reported that he had the pleasure of representing the Borough at Nor-Gwyn Baseball's opening day celebration on Saturday.
