Boards & Commissions Meetings

The Borough's boards and commissions hold monthly meetings at Borough Hall to evaluate the completeness and accuracy of their respective projects. All meetings are open to the public and begin promptly at 7 P.M., unless specified otherwise. Please see Borough website for more information.

Historical Architectural Review Board (HARB)

3rd Wednesday of the month

HARB's interest is in preserving the distinct and historic character of the Borough. If you reside or own a property within the historic district, the HARB reviews permits and/or requests to the alterations of your property.

Historic Commission

3rd Tuesday of the month

Committed to sharing and preserving the story and heritage of historic North Wales, they invite the public to attend meetings and learn about the rich historic culture of the Borough.

Nor-Gwyn Pool Commission

2nd Thursday of the month at 7:30 P.M. Safety and maintenance of the Nor-Gwyn public pool is their priority.

North Wales Water Authority Board

2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month at 5:00 P.M. Maintaining the safety and integrity of the Borough's drinking water is their primary goal.

Parks & Recreation Board

2nd Thursday of the month

The commission meets to promote the safety, function, and development of our parks.

Planning Commission

1st Wednesday of the month

Their mission is to ensure that the Borough's Comprehensive Plan and Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance are consistent with the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code.

Shade Tree Commission

2nd Thursday of the month

Their mission is to save the tree canopy that makes North Wales so beautiful. The Commission's responsibility is to plan and make recommendations to Borough Council for the planting, replacement, removal, protection, and needed maintenance of shade trees that are within 10 feet of the edge of the paved surface of any street in the Borough.

Zoning Hearing Board

1st Tuesday of the month (as needed)

The Board hears and decides on applications for appeal from decisions of Borough officials, special exceptions and variances of zoning regulations.

Borough Parks

We have several parks and open spaces in the Borough that are perfect for family time, play, picnics, or quiet strolls:

Eighth Street Park

A park developed solely by children including a brick walking path, plantings, and benches.

Fourth Street Park

Native plants adorn the two front corners of the Park where open space is available for many activities. Children's baseball games are generally played here where the Borough made "enthusiasts" cheer on.

Hess Park

Located near the intersection of Eighth and Walnut Streets, Hess Park is a great place for a relaxing stroll.

It offers a walking path, play area, and pavilion.

Ninth Street Park

Located at Ninth and Church Streets, 1.44 acres of lush park is ideal for bird watching, enjoying the natural foliage, picnics, and games!

Second Street Park

Located at Second Street & Prospect Avenue, this tennis court area is open to the public seven days a week and closes at dusk.

Wee Walers

Located at 332-334 Shearer Street, Wee Walers is perfect for your little tots. Includes a playground equipped for children ages 8 and under.

Weingartner Park

Located at Second and Summit Streets, Weingartner Park offers 3 acres of passive land full of various Black Walnut, Norway Maple, White Pine, Dogwood, Beech, Sweetgum, Hemlock and Cherry trees as well as pathways and benches.

Adopt-a-Park Program

Residents, non-profit groups, and service groups can adopt a Borough Park and provide maintenance and clean-up. The Borough welcomes new ideas for the parks and encourages all residents to participate.

Local Businesses

North Wales Borough is home to over one hundred businesses able to accommodate many of your needs.
